New EU Funding and Financing Opportunities Available for Energy Projects in the Current Programming Period 2014-2020

Energy projects are at the centre of attention in the current programming period 2014-2020. Projects in the fields of energy efficiency (EE), renewable energies (RE) and CO2 reduction have a special focus due to their importance in reaching the Europe 2020 goals. Cohesion policy funding will allocate an estimated total of 36 billion EUR to investments in energy efficiency, renewable, smart grids and urban mobility. Horizon 2020 will designate approximately 5.4 billion EUR to research and innovation in "secure, clean and efficient energy" and 840 million EUR to energy efficiency alone. At least 13 billion EUR will be allocated to energy projects by DG DEVCO.

This seminar will offer the participants a practical overview of the most important EU funding possibilities available for energy projects in Europe and beyond. It will mainly focus on the support for EE and RE and inform, for instance, about the financial instruments offered by European Structural and Investment Funds (ESIF), Horizon 2020, and DG DEVCO. Moreover, it will offer to all public and private bodies as well as potential and current beneficiaries of EU support, interested in new funding possibilities, the opportunity to exchange experience with colleagues and find partners for future energy projects in and outside of Europe.



Dr Tudor Constantinescu is Principal Adviser to the Director General for Energy in the European Commission.

As economist and engineer, he is dedicated to the topic of sustainable and competitive energy policies. He has been an active member of the European policy community for 20 years. Before joining the European Commission, he set up as founding Executive Director the Buildings Performance Institute Europe (BPI Europe), the European pole of a global best practice network focusing on energy efficiency in buildings. He was President of the Romanian Agency for Energy Conservation (ARCE), the national governmental institution in charge of energy efficiency policies and programmes, and promoting renewable energy sources. For the period 2008-2009, he ensured the rotating presidency of the EnR network of European Energy Agencies. In the private sector, he led the development of the energy efficiency strategy for Petrom, the largest oil and gas producer in South-East Europe, and served for two years on the Board of the Romanian Energy Efficiency Fund. For eleven years, Tudor Constantinescu worked for the Energy Charter Secretariat in Brussels coordinating energy efficiency and related environmental activities on international level conducting large scale country reviews and studies on financing and fiscal instruments, carbon trading, and effects of market liberalisation.

Andrew Luff was appointed as EEDA's Head of European Structural Fund programmes in October 2007 and had responsibility for the delivery of the region's ERDF Competitiveness Programme for the 2007-2013 period and has also had responsibility for delivery of EEDA's European Social Fund (ESF) Co-Financing Plan. He has also worked with the England ERDF Managing Authority (Department for Communities and Local Government) on the transition of programme management arrangements following the UK Government's decision to abolish Regional Development Agencies. Since August 2011 he has been working with a range of organisations including two of the region's universities developing ERDF project proposals. He has recently led development of a European Structural and Investment Funds (ESIF) strategy for a sub-area of the proposed England National Programme.

1. Area of Application

The following terms and conditions settle the contractual relationship between conference participants and the European Academy for Taxes, Economics & Law Brauner Klingenberg GmbH [referred to as "European Academy for Taxes, Economics & Law" in the following]. Differing terms and conditions, as well as, other settlements and/or regulations have no validity.

2. Registration / Confirmation of Application

A registration can be made via internet, mail, fax, or email. The registration is considered granted and legally binding if not rejected by the European Academy for Taxes, Economics & Law in writing within seven (7) days after receipt of registration. The registration will be supplemented by a booking confirmation via email. Partial bookings are only valid for seminars designed in modules.

3 Service

4. Payment Date and Payment, Default of Payment
